RESOLUTION TO IMPLEMENT TELECONFERENCING REQUIREMENTS DURING A PROCLAIMED STATE OF EMERGENCY

PURSUANT TO ASSEMBLY BILL 361

WHEREAS, the Humboldt Transit Authority (HTA) is committed to preserving the Ralph M. Brown Act requirements that all meetings of a legislative body of a local agency be open and public and that any person may attend and participate in such meetings;

WHEREAS, A state of emergency was proclaimed by Governor's Executive Order N-33-20 on March 4, 2020, addressing the threat of the COVID-19 pandemic, and remains in effect;

WHEREAS, the Brown Act allows for legislative bodies to hold meetings by teleconference, but imposes specific requirements for doing so;

WHEREAS, on March 17, 2020, in order to address the need for public meetings during the present public health emergency, Governor Newsom issued Executive Order No. N-29-20, suspending the Act's teleconferencing requirements; and

WHEREAS, on June 11, 2021, Governor Newsom issued Executive Order No. N-8-21, continuing the suspension of the Brown Act's teleconferencing requirements through September 30, 2021; and

WHEREAS, these Executive Orders allowed legislative bodies to meet virtually as long as certain notice and accessibility requirements were met; and

WHEREAS, the State Legislature amended the Brown Act through Assembly Bill No. 361 (AB 361) on September 16, 2021; and

WHEREAS, AB 361 amended the Brown Act so that a local agency may use teleconferencing without complying with the regular teleconferencing requirements of the Act, where the legislative body holds a meeting during a proclaimed state of emergency and makes certain findings; and

WHEREAS, COVID-19 and variants thereof remain a current threat to the health and safety of the general public, HTA Staff, and members of this Board; and

WHEREAS, the Humboldt County Department of Health & Human Services issued a Recommendation Regarding Physical Distancing Including Meetings of Legislative Bodies on September 29, 2021, which recommends physical distancing at gatherings and events, including meetings of local agency legislative bodies, and acknowledges that virtual meetings of legislative bodies provide a safer environment with less risk of exposure to COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, the HTA has an important governmental interest in protecting the health, safety, and welfare of those who participate in meetings of the HTA legislative and advisory bodies subject to the Brown Act; and

WHEREAS, in response to the current threat to the public of the COVID-19 virus and its existing and potential variants, the Humboldt County indoor mask order, and the Humboldt County recommendation

that local agency legislative bodies meet virtually, there is a desire to implement teleconference meetings pursuant to the requirements of the Brown Act so long as this State of and Emergency and local recommendations continue to exist.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Humboldt Transit Authority hereby finds, determines, declares, orders, and resolves as follows:

- 1. That the foregoing recitals are true and correct and incorporates them by this reference;
- 2. The Board of Directors finds, by a majority vote, that there exists a proclaimed state of emergency; and
- 3. The Humboldt County Department of Health & Human Services has ordered the wearing of masks at all indoor public gatherings and recommends that legislative bodies practice physical distancing by conducting virtual meetings, and

In accordance with AB 361, based on the findings and determinations herein, meetings of HTA's legislative will be held remotely by virtual means, while providing for all feasible means of public participation.

This resolution shall be effective upon adoption and remain in effect until HTA's next special board meeting in March 10, 2022, when HTA shall consider renewing its findings by subsequent resolution, in accordance with AB 361.

SUBJECT: Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Section 5310 Grant Funds

The California Department of Transportation has notified its sub-recipients that there are Federal Transit Administration Section 5310 grant funds available for Dial-A-Ride (DAR) services.

Staff is requesting approval from the HTA board to apply for three (5) Class A W/C equipped transit vehicles in the amount of \$420,000, of which \$400,000 is to be paid with 5310 Grant Funds and \$20,000 is to be paid with equipment reserve matching funds.

The vehicles would replace five older cutaways that have surpassed their useful life in both years and mileage based on FTA standards. Having newer equipment for the regions DAR service will reduce maintenance costs, reduce road calls, and improve on-time performance of the overall system.

<u>Action Recommended</u>: Adopt Resolution 19-03 Authorizing Application for FTA Section 5310 Grant Funds and authorize the General Manager to Sign the Grant Agreement.

SUBJECT: Low Carbon Transit Operations Program (LCTOP)

LCTOP is one of several programs that are part of the Transit, Affordable Housing, and Sustainable Communities Program established by the California Legislature in 2014 by Senate Bill 862 (SB 862). The LCTOP was created to provide operating and capital assistance for transit agencies to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and improve mobility, with a priority on serving disadvantaged communities. Approved projects in LCTOP will support new or expanded bus or rail services, expand intermodal transit facilities, and may include equipment acquisition, fueling, maintenance and other costs to operate those services or facilities, with each project required to reduce greenhouse gas emissions.

Staff was notified by the Humboldt County Association of Governments (HCAOG) that there was a total of \$360,372 in LCTOP funds available to HTA for projects that will reduce greenhouse gases. Staff would like to apply the total amount for free and/or reduced regional passes of offset the lost revenue due to the pandemic

The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) has adopted the following Certifications and Assurances for the Low Carbon Transit Operations Program (LCTOP). As a condition of the receipt of LCTOP funds, Lead Agency must comply with these terms and conditions.

A. General

- 1. The Lead Agency agrees to abide by the current LCTOP Guidelines and applicable legal requirements.
- 2. The Lead Agency must submit to Caltrans a signed Authorized Agent form designating the representative who can submit documents on behalf of the project sponsor and a copy of the board resolution appointing the Authorized Agent.

B. Project Administration

- 1. The Lead Agency certifies that required environmental documentation is complete before requesting an allocation of LCTOP funds. The Lead Agency assures that projects approved for LCTOP funding comply with Public Resources Code § 21100 and § 21150.
- 2. The Lead Agency certifies that a dedicated bank account for LCTOP funds only will be established within 30 days of receipt of LCTOP funds.
- 3. The Lead Agency certifies that when LCTOP funds are used for a transit capital project, that the project will be completed and remain in operation for its useful life.
- 4. The Lead Agency certifies that it has the legal, financial, and technical capacity to carry out the project, including the safety and security aspects of that project.
- 5. The Lead Agency certifies that they will notify Caltrans of pending litigation, dispute, or negative audit findings related to the project, before receiving an allocation of funds.
- 6. The Lead Agency must maintain satisfactory continuing control over the use of project equipment and facilities and will adequately maintain project equipment and facilities for the useful life of the project.
- 7. Any interest the Lead Agency earns on LCTOP funds must be used only on approved LCTOP projects.
- 8. The Lead Agency must notify Caltrans of any changes to the approved project with a Corrective Action Plan (CAP).

9. Under extraordinary circumstances, a Lead Agency may terminate a project prior to completion. In the event the Lead Agency terminates a project prior to completion, the Lead Agency must (1) contact Caltrans in writing and follow-up with a phone call verifying receipt of such notice; (2) pursuant to verification, submit a final report indicating the reason for the termination and demonstrating the expended funds were used on the intended purpose; (3) submit a request to reassign the funds to a new project within 180 days of termination.

C. Reporting

- 1. The Lead Agency must submit the following LCTOP reports:
 - a. Semi-Annual Progress Reports by May 15th and November 15th each year.
 - b. A Close Out Report within six months of project completion.
 - c. The annual audit required under the Transportation Development Act (TDA), to verify receipt and appropriate expenditure of LCTOP funds. A copy of the audit report must be submitted to Caltrans within six months of the close of the year (December 31) each year in which LCTOP funds have been received or expended.
 - d. Project Outcome Reporting as defined by CARB Funding Guidelines.
 - e. Jobs Reporting as defined by CARB Funding Guidelines.
- 2. Other Reporting Requirements: CARB develops and revises Funding Guidelines that will include reporting requirements for all State agencies that receive appropriations from the Greenhouse Gas Reduction Fund. Caltrans and project sponsors will need to submit reporting information in accordance with CARB's Funding Guidelines, including reporting on greenhouse gas reductions and benefits to disadvantaged communities.

D. Cost Principles

- 1. The Lead Agency agrees to comply with Title 2 of the Code of Federal Regulations 225 (2 CFR 225), Cost Principles for State and Local Government, and 2 CFR, Part 200, Uniform Administrative Requirements for Grants and Cooperative Agreements to State and Local Governments.
- 2. The Lead Agency agrees, and will assure that its contractors and subcontractors will be obligated to agree, that:
 - a. Contract Cost Principles and Procedures, 48 CFR, Federal Acquisition Regulations System, Chapter 1, Part 31, et seq., shall be used to determine the allow ability of individual project cost items and
 - b. Those parties shall comply with Federal administrative procedures in accordance with 2 CFR, Part 200, Uniform Administrative Requirements for Grants and Cooperative Agreements to State and Local Governments. Every sub-recipient receiving LCTOP funds as a contractor or sub-contractor shall comply with



Federal administrative procedures in accordance with 2 CFR, Part 200, Uniform Administrative Requirements for Grants and Cooperative Agreements to State and Local Governments.

3. Any project cost for which the Lead Agency has received funds that are determined by subsequent audit to be unallowable under 2 CFR 225, 48 CFR, Chapter 1, Part 31 or 2 CFR, Part 200, are subject to repayment by the Lead Agency to the State of California (State). All projects must reduce greenhouse gas emissions, as required under Public Resources Code section 75230, and any project that fails to reduce greenhouse gases shall also have its project costs submit to repayment by the Lead Agency to the State. Should the Lead Agency fail to reimburse moneys due to the State within thirty (30) days of demand, or within such other period as may be agreed in writing between the Parties hereto, the State is authorized to intercept and withhold future payments due the Lead Agency from the State or any third-party source, including but not limited to, the State Treasurer and the State Controller.

A. Record Retention

- 1. The Lead Agency agrees and will assure that its contractors and subcontractors shall establish and maintain an accounting system and records that properly accumulate and segregate incurred project costs and matching funds by line item for the project. The accounting system of the Lead Agency, its contractors and all subcontractors shall conform to Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP) and enable the determination of incurred costs at interim points of completion. All accounting records and other supporting papers of the Lead Agency, its contractors and subcontractors connected with LCTOP funding shall be maintained for a minimum of three (3) years after the "Project Closeout" report or final Phase 2 report is submitted (per ARB Funding Guidelines, Vol. 3, page 3.A-16), and shall be held open to inspection, copying, and audit by representatives of the State and the California State Auditor. Copies thereof will be furnished by the Lead Agency, its contractors, and subcontractors upon receipt of any request made by the State or its agents. In conducting an audit of the costs claimed, the State will rely to the maximum extent possible on any prior audit of the Lead Agency pursuant to the provisions of federal and State law. In the absence of such an audit, any acceptable audit work performed by the Lead Agency's external and internal auditors may be relied upon and used by the State when planning and conducting additional audits.
- 2. For the purpose of determining compliance with Title 21, California Code of Regulations, Section 2500 et seq., when applicable, and other matters connected with the performance of the Lead Agency's contracts with third parties pursuant to Government Code § 8546.7, the project sponsor, its contractors and subcontractors and the State shall each maintain and make available for inspection all books, documents, papers, accounting records, and other evidence pertaining to the performance of such contracts, including, but not limited to, the costs of administering those various contracts. All of the above referenced parties shall make such materials available at their respective offices at all reasonable times



during the entire project period and for three (3) years from the date of final payment. The State, the California State Auditor, or any duly authorized representative of the State, shall each have access to any books, records, and documents that are pertinent to a project for audits, examinations, excerpts, and transactions, and the Lead Agency shall furnish copies thereof if requested.

3. SUBJECT: Town of Samoa Public Transit

Starting in January of 2021, the County of Humboldt contracted with HTA and CAE Transport to provide public transportation for the Town of Samoa and the Phyllis-Rex Apartments. It was set up as a six-month pilot program to gauge ridership and to determine travel times for the schedule. This fiscal year, (21/22) HTA used CARES Act grant funds to continue the service to provide essential travel to residents that do not have any other means of transportation.

HTA does not yet have a Caltrans Standard Agreement for the next installment of CARES Act. To continue the service, HTA Staff would like to request up to \$145,000 in State Transit Assistance Funds 22/23 FY from the Humboldt County Association of Governments.

Action Recommended: Authorize Staff to request up to \$145,000 in State Transit Assistance Funds from the Humboldt County Association of Governments.
